I had the privilege this week of accompanying some children from Years 4, 5 and 6 to REACH Academy in Feltham for a sports tournament. As well as winning a silver medal each, the children were a delight to talk to on the bus journey, sharing their ideas, ambitions and sheer joy of life so freely and confidently. I was incredibly proud of how they conducted themselves in terms of their positive behaviour, excellent manners and also the way in which they embody the 'Values Curriculum' we have developed over the last year. Well done and thank you to Darcy, Scarlette, Biruk, Yushua, Charlie, Liliana and Archie.

This academic year, writing and maths are our two key learning foci, so during our staff meeting this week, we carried out a moderating session for writing in Year 3 using the technique of comparative marking. This saw our teachers making comparative judgements about the children's writing on a national platform which, as well as providing excellent professional development for staff, will help us to better understand what our next steps are in terms of moving writing forward at the school to ensure that all the children achieve excellent writing progress.

Our children in Early Years have some very exciting learning in store for them this afternoon as they begin their weekly Forest School afternoons in Chiswick Park. It is such a lovely time of year to explore and learn in a natural environment with crunchy, beautifully coloured leaves underfoot, puddles to splash and float things in, as well as looking at all the different animals and creepy crawlies in their natural environment.

I am continuing to award Reading Challenge badges to children who achieve each stage of the challenge for their year group. Do please have a look on the website for the appropriate challenge books. Please continue to read with your child every evening – this might be a trickier book which you read aloud.
