Safety

The staff, children and parents of both this school and St Mary's are very concerned about the behaviour of drivers from both schools who are putting the safety of our children at risk as they come to and leave school. There have been a number of occasions recently when drivers have narrowly missed pedestrians.

Any traffic outside of the school is a potential danger to the children. We have consistently asked parents not to drive to the school gates and not to park outside of the school gates. Despite this when members of staff have drawn parents' attention to the fact that they should not be there, they have faced rudeness and one member of staff actually described the way a parent spoke to her as 'aggressive'.

On behalf of the community of both schools, we will not tolerate this behaviour by people who will not put the interests of the children first. We will not have our children put at risk by drivers who are so inconsiderate of the needs of our pupils that they continue to drive up to the school gates.

From 2011 – 2013 69% of all child road casualties occurred close to a school. This equates to 31,470 child related incidents (or 201 a week) compared to 13,931 away from schools.

Members of school staff will continue to be at the gates of the school when they can and will expect the support of all parents in ensuring the well-being of children. In addition we have asked Chiswick Police to mount a presence at the gates when they are available. We will not hesitate to take the number plates of cars if they are parked outside of school.

We ask all parents to consider the safety and well-being of children of the schools and not to drive past the end of Fraser Street.
