Message from the Headteacher

A very warm welcome back to school after the Christmas break – I hope you have all had a chance to recharge your batteries over the holiday period. I would like to express my thanks for the many wonderful cards and gifts I received at the end of last term – the sentiments that you shared were very much appreciated and helped to reinforce my deeply held belief that we are all working together in the very best interests of the children.

This term we have definitely hit the ground running. I was so proud to walk around the school with our new deputy, Katie Rees, on Tuesday morning, dropping into classes and introducing her to our wonderful children who were already hard at work on their English and Maths at the start of the first day back at school. I am pleased to be able to share that from next week, all the children at The William Hogarth School will benefit from the very highest quality Art, Music and Computing lessons delivered by specialists in their fields. As a school, this will help us to guarantee that our children receive the best opportunities to develop their skills through a truly inclusive and enriching curriculum.

I am also excited to announce that the Local Authority has responded very positively to my requests for renewal of the entirety of the perimeter fencing to the school. Not only will this improve the outward appearance of the school, it will also improve the site security, helping us to keep the children safe. On this note, just a quick reminder please that children should not be cycling or scooting once they enter the school grounds. This will help to prevent any unfortunate accidents and injuries. Likewise, if children are staying at the end of the day to enjoy the playground facilities, please ensure that they are supervised.

Next week, our Anomaly screens will be installed in both playgrounds. Not only will these pass on useful information concerning well-being, healthy lifestyles and general school information, they will also provide the children with an extremely engaging suite of playground activities, exercises and games. The screens themselves are very robust, so please do have a go with them once they are up and running.

From Monday 15th January, we will be introducing a ‘SOFTSTART’ procedure for the start of the school day. This is partly in response to recommendations from the clear air audit that was carried out last term. One of the points that was raised was that children are lining up outside in the playground at a point in the day when traffic on the busy main road is at its peak. In order to ameliorate this situation, the children will no longer line up in the playground before school. Instead, they will be able to go straight to their classes from 0845. Details of the precise procedures are set out below for you – if you have any queries, please do not hesitate to speak to either myself, Miss Rees, or Mrs Colley-Purohit. Alternatively, the school office staff will be more than happy to help.

SOFTSTART PROCEDURES

1. 'Softstart' will be introduced from Monday 15th January.
2. Instead of lining up in the playground, children can go straight into their classroom from 0845
3. Children's entrance points will be as follows:
 - Reception : reception playground gate
 - Year 1 : year 1 gate
 - Year 2 : Year 2 stairs door
 - Year 3 & Year 4 : Year 4 stairs door
 - Year 5 : classroom doors
 - Year 6 : Year 6 corridor door
4. Children's entrances will be staffed from 0845
5. Children's entrances will be closed promptly at 0855 for Years 1 – 6, and at 0900 for Reception children
6. Accompanying adults / parents will not be able to enter the school building via the children's entrances. If parents / carers need to leave a message for the class teacher, they can do so with the staff member supervising the entrance or by visiting the school office
7. Children who arrive after 0855 should go directly to the school office for a late slip
8. Gates onto the school site from Devonshire Street and Duke Road will be closed promptly at 0905.
