Late Desk

We hope that all parents are making sure that their child is punctual and in school for the start of the day, every day.

Free childcare and early learning for 2 year olds

Do you have a 2 year old?

If you can answer yes to any of the questions below then you may be eligible for up to 15 hours free childcare and early learning each week for your two year old child.

Do you receive working tax credit and earn less than £16,190?

Do you receive one of the following?

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seekers' Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit.

Or does your child:

- have a current statement of Special Educational Needs or an Education, Health and Care plan?
- receive Disability Living Allowance?

Or:

- is your child looked after by the local authority?
- has your child left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangement order or adoption order?

Free childcare can support your child's learning and development. Your child will be able to learn to share and socialise which may help them to be ready to start school.

It is also good because it can give you a bit more time to do other things and maybe even take up a college course.

You can check your child's eligibility up to three months before his/her second birthday by either:
