School Hall – No Access

There is no longer any access through the school hall from the main reception area. Children and parents going to the Year 6 classrooms, the Year 5 classrooms, Nursery or Aktiva in the morning or afternoon will need to walk around the school building and across the back playground. This is in order not to disrupt clubs and sessions that are taking place both before and after school.

Cycling



Although we love to see so many of our school community using bicycles and scooters to travel to and from school, in the interests of safety can all children and adults please refrain from cycling or riding scooters through the playground. All bikes and scooters **must be locked up** in the shed or in the scooter pods provided, they cannot be stored inside the school building or school office.

Safety and Supervision Before and After School

Please do not send your child to school alone before 8:45am - Staff are not available to supervise children in the playground before 8:45am or after 3:30pm. Please leave the school grounds promptly at home time so as not to interrupt afterschool clubs that are taking place. Please remember to always **close the school gate** behind you. Children must be accompanied at all times after the end of the school day and are not permitted back into the school building unless they are accompanied by their parent/carer.

Parents should not try to access school before 3.20pm to collect their child(ren). If you arrive before then you should remain at the gate. Please do not wait in the playground as this is disruptive to lessons that are continuing until 3:30.

Lunch Boxes – No Nuts!

We have a number of children who have a serious nut allergy and for this reason we are a nut free school. Please do not include any products in your children's lunch boxes that contain nuts. This includes peanut butter.



