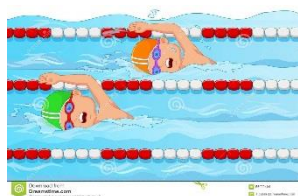
Cyclist Dismount! - No Cycling on the School Playground

I Can Cycle

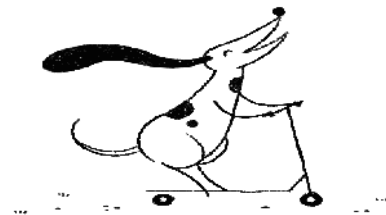
As the weather is getting warmer we are hoping to continue to encourage as many children as possible to travel to school in a sustainable way.
