There is no denying that this half term has been extremely busy, with Ofsted's visit and end of Key Stage exams for Year 2 and Year 6 children. Today, you will have received my letter and accompanying Ofsted Report, so I have kept my newsletter piece for the week relatively brief.

The Ofsted Report highlights phonics and reading as a key strength of the school. With this in mind, I am really looking forward to awarding our first badges to children who have completed a stage of the **Reading Challenge**. The **Reading Challenge** will be an ongoing feature of our approach to encouraging children at The William Hogarth School to read for pleasure. Children can bring their response tasks into school as soon as they are completed so that they can see how close they are to earning an award badge. I am really looking forward to being able to display some of these on the display board outside the library. Full details of the **Reading Challenge** are included on the school website.



Running alongside this, I am pleased to launch our hunt for **Extreme Readers!** Where is the most extreme place you have ever read a book? Up a tree? On top of a mountain? Standing on your head? Books don't need electricity! We can read them anywhere and everywhere! 
