Note to Parents with Children in Year 6

Secondary school admissions – Advice From LB Hounslow below

If your child was born between 1 September 2004 and 31 August 2005 he/she will need to apply for a secondary school place from September 2015.

You must apply online [using e-admissions](#). We will not be using paper application forms this year. All online applications must be submitted by the closing date of 31 October 2015.

If you do not live in Hounslow, you must apply directly to the council in which you permanently live, even if applying for schools in another borough. Please note we do not process applications for independent fee paying schools.

We advise all parents to read our [Transfer to Secondary School in 2016 brochure](#) ( PDF Help, size 2258kb) before making an application. This brochure gives you full information on the application process.

Supplementary Information Forms
