Message from the Headteacher

This week has seen a lot of visitors to the school, some of whom were potential candidates for the Deputy Head position. Each and every visitor remarked on the things which first attracted me to The William Hogarth School:

- The warmth and friendliness of everybody they met
- The determined learning attitudes of the children
- The tangible sense of purpose and energy about the school
- The enormous potential of The William Hogarth School to become a recognised centre of excellence in the local community.

Continuing in this vein, Mrs McGahey has been analysing pupil outcomes from the last academic year. Of particular note is the performance of our Early Years Department. The Reception children at The William Hogarth School did exceptionally well, outperforming many local schools. In terms of hard data, only 10 other schools in the Borough achieved better results for Early Years. This is an achievement we can be justifiably proud of and I will keep you posted on other statistical highlights over the coming weeks.

As part of our efforts to improve the school environment, teachers and support staff have been hard at work updating the corridor displays. Caroline Field has very kindly and generously offered to support these improvements by using her professional skills to conduct some photo shoots of the children at work and play. I look forward to seeing the results of her endeavours which will be displayed throughout the school. I am very keen that we continue to build on this spirit of support for the school and I am aware that we have a talented body of parents and carers in our school community whose contribution to the improvement works would be invaluable. If you would like to get involved, do please let Mel or Alana in the office know.

The children have been digging over the vegetable patch and are keen to plant up some winter vegetables. They are currently looking for hardy varieties of onions, beans, leeks, cabbages or greens to grow over the winter. e-safety

It has come to our attention that while several of our children enjoy playing the 'Roblox' game online, some e-safety concerns have arisen.

While we accept that such online games can be educational and enjoyable, there are social media aspects of this game that have been deemed unsuitable for children, (<https://www.familyzone.com/blog/roblox-parents-review>).

If you are unsure if a game like 'Roblox' is appropriate or not, even with ratings help, please try looking on YouTube for videos that demonstrate how games are played. This can be a great way to familiarise yourself with the virtual world they wish to join.

You can also consult websites such as 'Family Zone', 'Pegi', 'Mumsnet' and 'Commonsensemedia.org' to help you decide what is appropriate for your child.

Remember: You can help your child to stay safe online by:

- Keeping ICT in a family friendly room
- Using parental controls
- Finding out who they play games with and how well they know them
- Making sure they aren't giving away too much information about themselves while playing with 'friends'
- Ensuring that before your child plays any games online, they know how to 'block' individuals who may cause them problems
- Getting them to demonstrate how they play a game
- Making sure they understand when to report someone and also understand that they could be reported if they break the rules
- Encouraging them to take breaks every hour or so (parental controls can force this to happen or you could use a timer so they know how long they have left).


