Message from the Headteacher

Autumn has finally arrived with a chill in the air and leaves settling on the ground. I seem to have spent a fair bit of time outside this week, with visits from a number of specialists who may be able to help us with our ideas to transform the playgrounds. This provided many delightful opportunities, but perhaps none more so than spending time with the Key Stage 1 children at playtime as they enjoyed themselves collecting leaves of various shapes and jewel bright colours.

David, a landscape designer from Groundwork, has agreed to draw up plans and proposals at no cost to the school, so that we are able to bid for funding from the Mayor's office and various other organisations. This is exciting, as a huge focus for the Mayor this year is projects that will help to combat air pollution. I know the air quality around the school is an ongoing concern for many of you given our proximity to the main road, but David has already made several suggestions for improving the density and type of planting to remove some of these pollutants. Being able to bid for additional sources of funding will help to facilitate the process of improving our outside space in these times of austerity and diminishing school budgets.

I have to say an enormous thank you to Steve Riley from Will to Win. He has named The William Hogarth School as his chosen charity on their JustGiving page and has already managed to raise over £200 by running a half marathon. The money that Will to Win raise on our behalf will go towards improving the surface of the ball park. This will mean that the children benefit from greater opportunities to use the space for structured PE lessons, as well as having it available during free play. Details of the JustGiving page are included on the newsletter and the school website – many thanks if you feel you are able to make even a small donation towards this.

Year 3 had a successful trip to the British Museum this week and were able to take the iPads donated by the PTA with them. Elizabeth Cook has taken over the role of PTA Chair from Caroline Karaca - I would like to thank Caroline for her tireless work in supporting the school and community. I very much look forward to working closely with the PTA this year to continue to build successful links involving the whole school community. Educational research demonstrates time and time again, that parental engagement is the second biggest factor (after good quality teaching) in positively impacting on pupil outcomes, so do please get involved in whatever capacity you are able.

Next week will close with Black History Assembly at the end of the day – we would be delighted if you are able to join us, however I appreciate this might be difficult in terms of timing. I apologise for the timing of the assembly – this was unavoidable as the Year 3 African Mask-Making and Dance workshops will take place throughout the day on Friday, and the resulting performance will be an integral element of the assembly.


